Meet Paul Newman

Lots of people know Paul to be a pretty good pickleball player here at the Y, but many may not know of his incredibly interesting life.



Paul grew up in Collinwood and then went off to college at Bowling Green. However, after one semester, with money running low, Paul decided to join the Army in 1967 to get a little help through the GI bill. Paul was sent to Vietnam where he was assigned to the 82nd Airborne, 3rd Brigade as a Trooper. After one tour of duty, he was then sent back again to Vietnam, and this time was a Ranger with the 9th Infantry Division. Paul was injured during this tour and spent 5 months in the hospital. He was honorably discharged as a disabled veteran in 1970. While serving in the military, Paul received numerous medals for his courageous service.

With the Army behind him, Paul married his wife Merrilou and went back to school. He graduated with a Bachelor's Degree in Biology and a Master's Degree in English from Case Western Reserve University. He then went on to get his Law Degree from Cleveland State. After graduation and passing the Bar Exam, Paul spent a few years with the Chardon firm of Svete, Hofstetter, & Bond before starting a firm of his own. The firm grew to be called Newman, Leary & Brice. While serving his clients, Paul was also involved in many political positions such as President of the Geauga County Board of Education and was on the Geauga County Board of Elections. He also was affiliated with the following civic organizations: Burton-Middlefield Rotary Club, Geauga County Historical Society, Chardon Chamber of Commerce, and the Chardon Square Association. Paul also has served on the Geauga County Library Board of Trustees for 35 years and was president of the Board during several of those vears.

Photography is a real love of Paul's and he has published several books of his photos such as "Geauga County Century Homes", "Geauga County Barns", and "Geauga County Churches". He also has written and published 3 books: "Joe B" (a novel that is a modern day parallel to the life of Job), Nine From The Ninth (Stories of Rangers in Vietnam) and finally, "Murder At The Maple Festival" (a historical rendition of the Chardon Maple Festival with a murder involved). Paul also loves to travel. He has backpacked through most of the National Parks, traveled to 23 countries and canoed the entire Ohio portion of the Ohio River. Paul is currently raising his 12 year old grandson. Say hello to this great guy when you see him
